The Hound of Heaven

- I. Pursuing Adam Genesis 3:7-11
 - A. Nakedness = shame Revelation 3:18
 - B. What do you want? God provides garments of skins to cover their nakedness and shame.

 Genesis 3:21
- II. Pursuing Jacob
 - A. What do you want? A blessing. Genesis 32:24-26
- III. Pursuing Israel in the Wilderness
 - A. What do you want? Meat and women who are not followers of the true God.
 - B. God allows them to have their own way ("gave them up to their own heart's lust.") **Psalms 81:10-12**
- IV. Pursuing David
 - A. What do you want? Restoration as requested in Psalms 51:10-12
- V. Pursuing the unfaithful lover (Gomer)
 - A. What do you want? That which is not good.
 - B. God steps up His program of alluring us. Hosea 2:14
- VI. Pursuing the Prodigal Son
 - A. What do you want? Give me what I have been deprived of. Luke 15:12

- B. When we see our sorry condition and remember our Father's love, we "come to our self", and want to return. **Luke 15:17**
- C. Our response now to God is "make me". Luke 15:19
- VII. What does <u>God</u> want? He is not willing that any should perish. **2 Peter 3:9**
 - A. But we just want our own way all the time in everything.
- VIII. God always honors our freedom of choice. The frightening aspect of **Romans 1:28**.
- IX. When Jesus comes there will be only two groups of people:
 - A. To the one group God will say that He has done everything possible to save them but they have persistently refused to have anything to do with Him, so He says "Have your own way".

 But God also says, "How can I give you up?" His heart is broken. Hosea 11:8
 - B. To the other group who have learned to say, "Lord, have Thine own way" He says, "Come ye blessed of the Father, enter into the joy of Thy Lord".
